

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Easter or should I say Christ is Risen! - Truly He is Risen! Have we ever needed more the message of Easter Hope than right now?! I'm not speaking of the Easter Hop of bunnies and chocolate eggs. But rather cosmos changing, life altering Truth that God the Father sent His only begotten Son to be born, to live, to suffer through his passion, die on the Cross for us and the Third Day be Raised from the Dead. It is not my intention to minimize the tremendous suffering, loss of livelihood and life of so many within our country and world.

As the Resurrection of our Lord is celebrated within the Eastern Rite of the Church it is chanted over and over again "Christ is Risen from the dead, trampling down death by death and upon those in the tombs bestowing Life!" Christ's victory over sin and death is our victory. I am heartened to hear how parishioners are "keeping the faith" in these times when public Masses are not possible. Parishioners are praying the rosary (the Irish call it "rattling your beads"), watching Masses, spiritual communions, reading the daily scriptures from Mass, getting groceries for neighbors and any number of corporal and spiritual works of mercy.

Progressing through Lent and now reaching Easter of our Lord's Resurrection has caused me to reflect on Sundays. Each Sunday is a Little Easter. Saturday is the Sabbath for the Jews—the day God rested from His work of creation. It is also the day God rested in the person of Jesus Christ, who "slept" in His Tomb on Holy Saturday. Our Lord has seen fit to rise on that first Easter morn. God created the world and all that is in it in six days, the seventh day He rested. The following day is the Day of Resurrection—the Eighth Day, a day of New Creation through Christ's Paschal Mystery! So while it is difficult to be away from Mass during this time, let us live the Good News that Jesus is Resurrected and He brings us Hope during difficult times! Christ is Risen! Truly He is Risen!

How to Recite How to Recite the Divine Mercy Chaplet Chaplet

The Chaplet of Mercy is recited using ordinary rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the Diary of Saint Faustina and followed by a closing prayer.

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross
- 2. Opening Prayers You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us. O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You! (Repeat three times)
- 3. The Our Father
- 4. The Hail Mary
- 5. The Apostles' Creed
- 6. On the "Our Father" bead before each decade: Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.
- 7. On the 10 "Hail Mary" beads of Each Decade: For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
- 8. Repeat "Eternal Father" and "For the Sake of His sorrowful Passion": (Number 6 & 7) prayers for four more decades.
- 9. After 5 decades, conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times) Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.
- 10. Optional Closing Prayer Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself. Amen
