WARNING ABOUT RISK ASSUMED BY PARISHIONERS

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.

A letter was sent to the parishioners at St. Anthony's and Sacred Heart. Please note that there was a typo in the bullet point of atrisk parishioners. Please note that at risk individuals should NOT attend Mass. Please spread the word and make sure your loved ones who are at risk stay home. Thank you!

If you have a fever or flu-like symptoms, recently traveled out of the country or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, you should stay home. All attendees must wear a face mask, or face covering, and keep proper distancing from each other.

•St. Anthony attendees must enter only through the middle front doors or the handicapped entrance.

•Sacred Heart attendees may enter through all of the three main entrances. We ask that you arrive early because of the new safety protocol.

•Everyone will be met at the door by an usher who will direct them to their seats and remain there until dismissed by an usher after Mass ends in order to keep the required spacing. This is a firm requirement necessary for us to keep our certification for Public Mass from the

Diocese.


•Collection baskets will not be passed during the offertory. Your contributions can be left in the places indicated.

•There will be no gift procession during the offertory; There will be no sign of peace before there Lamb of God. •You will remain at your place as communion is brought to you by the ministers. the Precious Blood will not be distributed.

•The faithful are encouraged to receive Communion in the hand and to carefully avoid any physical contact with the minister's hand when receiving. (If incidental hand contact occurs, the minister is to use sanitizer before proceeding).

•For now there will be no congregational singing. Missalettes & Hymnals have been removed so there are fewer things to be handled by multiple persons and therefore become a possible source of contagion.

We rejoice that we now can come together as members of Christ's Body to worship and help each other get to heaven. It has been too long since we were able to do that. May God continue to Bless our parishes and all the faithful of St. Anthony and Sacred Heart Parishes.

Reflection for the Fourteenth Sunday of the Year Readings: Zechariah 9:9–10 Psalm 145:1–2, 8–11, 13–14 Romans 8:9, 11–13 Matthew 11:25–30

Jesus is portrayed in today's Gospel as a new and greater Moses. Moses, the meekest man on earth (see <u>Numbers 12:3</u>), was God's friend (see <u>Exodus 34:12, 17</u>). Only he knew God "face to face" (see <u>Deuteronomy 34:10</u>). And Moses gave Israel the yoke of the Law, through which God first revealed Himself and how we are to live (see <u>Jeremiah 2:20; 5:5</u>). Jesus too is meek and humble. But He is more than God's friend. He is the Son who alone knows the Father. He is more also than a law-giver, presenting Himself today as the yoke of a new Law, and as the revealed Wisdom of God.

As Wisdom, Jesus was present before creation as the firstborn of God, the Father and Lord of heaven and earth (see <u>Proverbs 8:22</u>; <u>Wisdom 9:9</u>). And He gives knowledge of the holy things of the kingdom of God (see <u>Wisdom 10:10</u>). In the gracious will of the Father, Jesus reveals these things only to the "childlike"—those who humble themselves before Him as little children (see <u>Sirach 2:17</u>). These alone can recognize and receive Jesus as the just savior and meek king promised to daughter Zion, Israel, in today's First Reading.

receive Jesus as the just savior and meek king promised to daughter Zion, Israel, in today's First Reading. We too are called to childlike faith in the Father's goodness, as sons and daughters of the new kingdom, the Church. We are to live by the Spirit we received in Baptism (see <u>Galatians 5:16</u>), putting to death our old ways of thinking and acting, as Paul exhorts in today's Epistle. Our "yoke" is to be His new law of love (see <u>John 13:34</u>), by which we enter into the "rest" of His kingdom.

As we sing in today's Psalm, we joyously await the day when we will praise His name forever in the kingdom that lasts for all ages. This is the sabbath rest promised by Jesus—first anticipated by Moses (see Exodus 20:8–11), but which still awaits the people of God (see <u>Hebrews 4:9</u>).
