### WARNING ABOUT RISK ASSUMED BY PARISHIONERS

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.

If you have a fever or flu-like symptoms, recently traveled out of the country or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, you should stay home. All attendees must wear a face mask, or face covering, and keep proper distancing from each other.

- •St. Anthony attendees must enter only through the middle front doors or the handicapped entrance.
  •Sacred Heart attendees may enter through all of the three main entrances. We ask that you arrive early because of the new safety protocol.
- •Everyone will be met at the door by an usher who will direct them to their seats and remain there until dismissed by an usher after Mass ends in order to keep the required spacing. This is a firm requirement necessary for us to keep our certification for Public Mass from the Diocese
- •Collection baskets will not be passed during the offertory. Your contributions can be left in the places indicated.
- •There will be no gift procession during the offertory; There will be no sign of peace before there Lamb of God.
- •You will remain at your place as communion is brought to you by the ministers. the Precious Blood will not be distributed.
- •The faithful are encouraged to receive Communion in the hand and to carefully avoid any physical contact with the minister's hand when receiving. (If incidental hand contact occurs, the minister is to use sanitizer before proceeding).
- •For now there will be no congregational singing. Missalettes & Hymnals have been removed so there are fewer things to be handled by multiple persons and therefore become a possible source of contagion. If you would like a missalette to carry back and forth to Mass please ask an usher.

We rejoice that we can come together as members of Christ's Body to worship and help each other get to heaven. May God continue to Bless our parishes and all the faithful of St. Anthony and Sacred Heart Parishes.

Sunday Reflection: Readings Acts 4:32-35, Psalms 118:2-4. 13-15, 22-24, 1 John: 1-6, John 20: 19-31

Three times in today's Psalm we cry out a victory shout: "His mercy endures forever. "Truly we've known the everlasting love of God, who has come to us as our Savior. By the blood and water that flowed from Jesus' pierced side (see John 19:34), we've been made God's children, as we hear in today's Epistle. Yet we never met Jesus, never heard Him teach, never saw Him raised from the dead. His saving Word came to us in the Church—through the ministry of the apostles, who in today's Gospel are sent as he was sent. He was made a life-giving Spirit (see <a href="Lorinthians 15:45">1 Corinthians 15:45</a>) and He filled His apostles with that Spirit.

As we hear in today's First Reading, they bore witness to His resurrection with great power. And through their witness, handed down in the Church through the centuries, their teaching and traditions have reached us (see <a href="Acts 2:42">Acts 2:42</a>). We encounter Him as the apostles did—in the breaking of the bread on the Lord's day (see <a href="Acts 20:7">Acts 20:7</a>; 1 Corinthians 16:2; Revelation 1:10). There is something liturgical about the way today's Gospel scenes unfold. It's as if John is trying to show us how the risen Lord comes to us in the liturgy and sacraments. In both scenes it is Sunday night. The doors are bolted tight, yet Jesus mysteriously comes. He greets them with an expression, "Peace be with you," used elsewhere by divine messengers (see Daniel 10:19; Judges 6:23). He shows them signs of His real bodily presence. And on both nights the disciples respond by joyfully receiving Jesus as their "Lord."

Isn't this what happens in the Mass—where our Lord speaks to us in His Word, and gives himself to us in the sacrament of His body and blood? Let us approach the altar with joy, knowing that every Eucharist is the day the Lord has madetory of Easter is again made wonderful in our eyes.
