WARNING ABOUT RISK ASSUMED BY PARISHIONERS

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection.

If you have a fever or flu-like symptoms, recently traveled out of the country or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19,

you should stay home. All attendees must wear a face mask, or face covering, and keep proper distancing from each other.

•St. Anthony attendees must enter only through the middle front doors or the handicapped entrance.

•Sacred Heart attendees may enter through all of the three main entrances. We ask that you arrive early because of the new safety protocol.

•Everyone will be met at the door by an usher who will direct them to their seats and remain there until dismissed by an usher after Mass ends in order to keep the required spacing. This is a firm requirement necessary for us to keep our certification for Public Mass from the

Diocese.

•Collection baskets will not be passed during the offertory. Your contributions can be left in the places indicated.

•There will be no gift procession during the offertory; There will be no sign of peace before there Lamb of God. •You will remain at your place as communion is brought to you by the ministers. the Precious Blood will not be distributed.

•The faithful are encouraged to receive Communion in the hand and to carefully avoid any physical contact with the minister's hand when receiv-

ing. (If incidental hand contact occurs, the minister is to use sanitizer before proceeding).
•For now there will be no congregational singing. Missalettes & Hymnals have been removed so there are fewer things to be handled by multiple persons and therefore become a possible source of contagion. If you would like a missalette to carry back and forth to Mass please ask an usher.

Reflections on the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity: Readings: Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40, Psalm 33:4-6, 9, 18-20, 22, Romans 8:14-17, Matthew 28: 16-20

Last Sunday, we celebrated the sending of the Spirit, which sealed God's new covenant and made a new creation. In this new creation, we live in the family of God, who has revealed himself as a Trinity of love. We share in His divine nature through His Body and Blood (see <u>2 Peter 1:4</u>). This is the meaning of the three feasts that cap the Easter season— Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and Corpus Christi. These feasts should be intimate reminders of how deeply God loves us, how He chose us, from before the foundation of the world, to be His children (see <u>Ephesians 1:4–5</u>). Today's readings illuminate how all God's words and works were meant to prepare for the revelation of the Trinity and God's blessing in Jesus Christ—the blessing we inherited in Baptism, and renew in each Eucharist. By God's word the heavens and earth were filled with His kindness, we sing in today's Psalm. Out of love, God called Abraham and chose his descendants to be His own people, Moses says in today's First Reading (see <u>Deuteronomy 4:20,37</u>). Through the Israelites, He revealed to the nations that He alone is Lord and there is no other. In Jesus, God's word took flesh as a son of Abraham (see <u>Matthew 1:1</u>). And Jesus reveals in the Gospel today that the one God is Father, Son, and Spirit, and that He desires to make all people His own. As He led Israel out of Egypt, God freed us from slavery, Paul says in today's Epistle. As He adopted Israel (see <u>Romans 9:4</u>), He gives us the Spirit by which we can know Him as "Our Father. As God's heirs, we receive the commissions of Moses and Jesus today. We are to fix our hearts on Him, and to observe all that He has commanded. The Eucharist is His pledge—that He will be with us until the end, that He will deliver us from death to live forever in the promised land of His kingdom.
