

WARNING ABOUT RISK ASSUMED BY PARISHIONERS

While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection. •Collection baskets will not be passed during the offertory. Your contributions can be left in the places indicated. •There will be no gift procession during the offertory; There will be no sign of peace before there Lamb of God.

•You will remain at your place as communion is brought to you by the ministers. the Precious Blood will not be distributed.

Covid Protocols for St. Anthony's Church in Phase 5, June 11, 2021

Pew tape and social distancing tape will be removed from Church except for the "mask only" section which is located on the west side from the handicapped entrance to central west door.

Those who wish to be in the "mask only" section will be directed by the usher to that section and they may enter and leave through the handicapped ramp door. Mask wearers who do not want to sit in the "mask only" section may sit elsewhere.

Holy Communion will be taken to those in the "mask only" section as before.

Others will receive communion by coming up the center aisle, going right or left and returning to their seats. Holy communion will continue under only one species.

For now as usual only the Center Front door and the handicapped ramp door will be open.

Holy water will now be in use. Hand sanitizer will remain available as before.

There will continue to be no handshake at the "Sign of Peace" exchanged. The choir will resume singing.

Ushers passing the collection baskets and Extra Ordinary Ministers of the Eucharist will be reinstated in the future.

Reflections Readings: Job 38: 1 8-11, Psalm 107:23-26, 28-31,2 Corinthians 5:14-17, Mark 4: 35-41

"Do you not yet have faith?" Our Lord's question in today's Gospel frames the Sunday liturgies for the remainder of the year, which the Church calls "Ordinary Time." I n the weeks ahead, the Church's liturgy will have us journeying with Jesus and His disciples, reliving their experience of His words and deeds, coming to know and believe in Him as they did. Notice that today's Psalm almost provides an outline for the Gospel. We sing of sailors caught in a storm; in their desperation, they call to the Lord and He rescues them. Mark's Gospel today also intends us to hear a strong echo of the story of the prophet Jonah. He, too, was found asleep on a boat when a life-threatening storm broke out that caused his fellow travelers to pray for deliverance, and then to marvel when the storm abated (see Jonah 1:3–16). But Jesus is something greater than Jonah (see Matthew 12:41). And Mark wants us to come to see what the

Apostles saw—that God alone has the power to rebuke the wind and the sea (see <u>Isaiah 50:2</u>; <u>Psalm 18:16</u>). This is the point of today's First Reading. If even the wind and sea obey Him, shouldn't we trust Him in the chaos and storms of our own lives? As with the Apostles, the Lord has asked each of us to cross to the other side, to leave behind our old ways to travel with Him in the little ship of the Church. I n their fear today, they call Him, "Teacher." And it is only faith in His teaching that can save us from perishing. We should trust in Christ, and trust like Christ—who was able to sleep through the storm, confident that God was with Him (see <u>Psalm 116:6</u>; <u>Romans 8:31</u>). We should live in thanksgiv-ing for our salvation, as today's Epistle tells us—as new creations, no longer for ourselves but for Him who died for our sake. Dr. Scott Hahn
