While our parish staffs will attempt to take appropriate precautions consistent with the advice of public health authorities, parishioners and guests should understand that they assume the risk of contracting COVID-19 anytime they enter a public space since such precautions do not eliminate the risk of infection. •There will be no gift procession during the offertory; There will be no sign of peace before there Lamb of God.

•You will remain at your place as communion is brought to you by the ministers. the Precious Blood will not be distributed.

Covid Protocols for St. Anthony's Church in Phase 5, June 11, 2021

Pew tape and social distancing tape will be removed from Church except for the "mask only" section which is located on the west side from the handicapped entrance to central west door.

Those who wish to be in the "mask only" section will be directed by the usher to that section and they may enter and leave through the handicapped ramp door. Mask wearers who do not want to sit in the "mask only" section may sit elsewhere.

Holy Communion will be taken to those in the "mask only" section as before.

Others will receive communion by coming up the center aisle at SA and at SH using the side aisles and returning to their seats. Holy communion will continue under only one species.

For now as usual only the Center Front door and the handicapped ramp door will be open.

Holy water will now be in use. Hand sanitizer will remain available as before.

There will continue to be no handshake at the "Sign of Peace" exchanged. The SAchoir will resume singing.

Ushers passing the collection baskets and Extra Ordinary Ministers of the Eucharist will be reinstated in the future.

Reflections Readings: Wisdom 1:13-15, 2:23-24, Psalm 30:2, 4-6, 11-13, 2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15, Mark 5:21-24, 35-43

God, who formed us in His imperishable image, did not intend for us to die, we hear in today's First Reading. Death entered the world through the devil's envy and Adam and Eve's sin; as a result, we are all bound to die. But in the moving story in today's Gospel, we see Jesus liberate a little girl from the possession of death. On one level, Mark is recounting an event that led the disciples to understand Jesus' authority and power over even the final enemy, death (see 1 Corinthians 15:26). On another level, however, this episode is written to strengthen our hope that we too will be raised from the dead, along with all our loved ones who sleep in Christ (see 1 Corinthians 15:18). Jesus commands the girl to "Arise!"—using the same Greek word used to describe His own resurrection (see Mark 16:6). And the consoling message of today's Gospel is that Jesus is the resurrection and the life. If we believe in Him, even though we die, we will live (see John 15:25–26). We are called to have the same faith as the parents in the Gospel today—praying for our loved ones, trusting in Jesus' promise that even death cannot keep us apart. Notice the parents follow Him Even though those in their own house tell them there is no hope, and even though others ridicule Jesus' claim that the dead have only fallen asleep (see 1 Thessalonians 4:13–18). Already in Baptism, we've been raised to new life in Christ. And the Eucharist, like the food given to the little girl today, is the pledge that He will raise us on the last day. We should rejoice, as we sing in today's Psalm, that He has brought us up from the netherworld, the pit of death. And, as Paul exhorts in today's Epistle, we should offer our lives in thanksgiving for this gracious act, imitating Christ in our love and generosity for others.
